REFLECTION FOR ADVENT 4

Lord, now lettest Thou Thy servant depart in peace, according to Thy word: For mine eyes have seen Thy salvation, which Thou hast prepared before the face of all people; A light to lighten the Gentiles, and the glory of Thy people Israel. (Luke 2:29-32)

The life of faith involves waiting – it's enshrined in our church calendar. But Advent and Lent are different seasons of waiting. Waiting can be joyful, but it can be uncomfortable. Before Peter and Oliver were born, we experienced joyful anticipation of their arrival. More recently, during Easter 2023, we experienced anxious waiting at a hospital bedside. Waiting is hard.

We meet Simeon and Anna in Luke 2:22-40. They are two devout Israelites, waiting for the consolation of Israel – this is not the British 'consolation prize', which is achieved amidst an otherwise overwhelming defeat. This consolation is the comfort God speaks to His people through Isaiah, when He says 'Comfort, comfort my people'. Better times are coming soon: their exile will end, and God Himself will come and dwell with them.

And when Simeon and Anna see Jesus, they see that God has fulfilled all His promises. Imagine the moment: Joseph and Mary have travelled from Bethlehem to the temple in Jerusalem. They're here to present Jesus to the Lord as their firstborn son. Then a random elderly man comes up to them and takes their son in his arms. He looks down upon this helpless baby and says to God: "my eyes have seen your salvation."

Did you notice what Simeon doesn't say, though? He doesn't say that he's seen the Lord's Christ, the anointed one who would rule God's people. He's been waiting for that, so we might expect Simeon to say that.

But Simeon says that he has seen "your salvation" (meaning a salvation which belongs to God and comes from Him). This song is called the Nunc Dimittis, and we may know it well from Evening Prayer. But, when we say it together, never forget that Simeon holds the Christ child in his arms. Simeon's not talking about God's salvation in an abstract sense but giving thanks to God for Jesus. And Simeon isn't merely looking to the future. In Jesus, salvation has already arrived.

Though Jesus has come once, we are in a moment of waiting just like Simeon and Anna. We're waiting for Jesus to come back when our waiting will turn to fulfilment in Christ. He will usher in the renewed creation where righteousness dwells, where we'll dwell with God forever as His people. On that day, there will be no more death, suffering or sin. There is much we're still waiting for. But Simeon saw that, whilst there was much still to be done, salvation had nevertheless arrived in Christ. So, as we wait for the second coming of Jesus, may we know that same peace and fulfilment that Simeon and Anna knew as they looked at the Christ child.
