Families and Young People

Rev David has been spear-heading our work with children, families, and young people.

Along with Betty Csüllög, he has started our Parent & Toddler group, Pebbles, at the Falcon Mews. Initially we've been meeting fortnightly and have established a 'core' membership

of around 15 children with their parents/carers. And it's been a real joy to welcome some of the families to our Gather and Easter services.

David has also been working with our young people. They have formed 'Boulders', which gives space for Bible study, prayer, food, and fun.

And what next? Rev Phil & Rev David are prayerfully considering running a two/three-day Holiday Club in the summer holidays.

In February we held our Deanery-wide Marriage Preparation Day at St Peter, Bromyard. This is the second year of the Deanery working together to host this event. Lent

Our journey through Lent started on Ash Wednesday with two 'Ashing' services at St Peter, Bromyard.

Mid-way through Lent, St Peter & St Paul, Stoke Lacy, held a Lent Luch at Stoke Lacy Village Hall, bringing together members of the church and community around soup, bread, cheese, and chat.

During Lent, a group has come together to explore the Bible through the Bible Society Bible Course. In the first five sessions we've covered the Old Testament, with some lively and stimulating discussions following the video presentations. We will be completing the course after Easter with three sessions on the New Testament.

Bromyard Deanery

The Bromyard Deanery covers 22 churches, gathered together in 4 Benefices (Bromyard & Stoke Lacy, Bredenbury, Frome Valley, Greater Whitbourne).

Much of our discussion has been around the setting up of a Group Ministry, enabling the four Benefices to work more closely together. The Group Ministry is in the process of being set up, the next stage being approval from Bishop Richard.

One of the first areas for closer working is Family and Children's ministry. Greater Whitbourne have established seasonal 'Fun Days' over the last couple of years, and we are now working on building a Deanery-wide team to support these and develop other opportunities for working with families and children. As part of this, the next vacancy within the Deanery will have a special responsibility for School and Young People's work.

Future Plans

Party in the Park

On Sunday 4th May at 10:00am we will be gathering at Kempson Playing Field for a time of worship as part of Party in the Park. This is an opportunity for us to meet and chat with people from the wider community, to get to know them, and to pray for them. St Peter's music group will be leading worship from the main stage.

At the end of the day, at 6:30pm, we will share communion at St Peter's, and we will pray for all the people and conversations that we've had in the morning.

Rev David Hall Priesting

Rev David is going to be ordained as a Priest on Saturday 5th July at Hereford Cathedral. This will be a joyful, and joyous celebration of the next stage of Rev David's growing into ministry.

On Sunday 6th July, Rev David will be presiding for the first time at Holy Communion, 10:30am at St Peter, Bromyard. Do put both these dates in your diary!

Buildings plans

At St Peter & St Paul, Stoke Lacy, we have recently replaced the old storage shed with a larger, better waterproofed shed. This has facilitated a clear out and appraisal of what we have stored away.

In Bromyard, the Diocese has bought out our share of the curacy house in Lower Thorn which has released a significant sum of money. The first step of a wider plan for St Peter's building is to remove the pew plinths in order to level the floor. This will create a much safer, and more useable space for Gather, Pebbles, youth work, concerts, art exhibitions etc.

We also have a potential legacy which has been left specifically for reworking the entrance to St Peter's. We'll know more about this in June/July.
