"A new command I give you: Love one another."

Aw, well that's nice isn't it!

"As I have loved you, so you must love one another."

To love like Jesus loves us.

"Greater love has no-one than this, that he lay down his life for his friends."

Hold you hard!

Saying 'Love one another', well that's okay; to say we must love like Jesus loves us, yeah, well that gives us a yard stick, a standard; but 'that he lay down his life' that's a bit too far!

Jesus is talking to His disciples, this rag-tag bunch of humanity; the ever impetuous Peter; James and John the sons of thunder; the slightly other-worldly John; Mary Magdalene, from whom Jesus had driven out the evil spirits.
