REFLECTION: Trinity 8

Richard Dawkins believes that I am an uneducated, unquestioning person.

Not just me, I might add, but anyone who claims to have a faith.

According to Dawkins, 'more highly educated people are less likely to be religious'.

Well, I went to an ordinary comprehensive school, scraped 9 'O' levels (4 A's, 3 B's, a D and an E), just about got an 'A' level and finally gained a Foundation Degree in Christian Theology at the age of 51. So, he may be right about my being uneducated.

In 'The God Delusion', Dawkins vents that 'Faith is an evil precisely because it requires no justification and brooks no argument'.

Jesus said, 'Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength'. 'All your mind' must include reason, logic, intellect.

Peter encourages us to, 'Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have'. What is your justification for believing what you believe?

And in Isaiah, God calls us to, 'Come now, let us reason together...'.

In using our minds, our reason, logic, intellect, we constantly come up against arguments about our faith; why do I believe in God, in Jesus, in the Holy Spirit; how can I resolve the differing views of God in the Bible; how do I get to grips with the life of Jesus when there are differences between the gospel accounts; what about suffering; what is the right position on abortion; what should be our priority when voting in a political election; the list goes on.

The writer of Proverbs 27:17 says, 'As iron sharpens iron, so one man sharpens another'. It's good to discuss, to be part of a Bible study group, to question one another, because it sharpens our minds.

I've spent the best part of 63 years being a disciple of Jesus, learning about Him and His love for me/us, learning about God who is Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, and immortal, invisible, God only wise.

So, Richard Dawkins, I may not be as educated as you are, but my faith is reasoned and argued out, and probably more questioned than your faith in Darwinian evolution.
