REFLECTION: Trinity 4

The Good Samaritan.

We all know the parable and it's meaning.

I find Jesus' initial question interesting:

"What is written in the Law?" he replied. "How do you read it?"

It's that little phrase, 'How do you read it?' which intrigues me. Checking it in my handy Greek translation Bible, the phrase appears to be:

'In the law what has been written? How readest thou?'

Jesus seems to be inviting the expert in the law the opportunity to interpret the law as he sees it.

It is the way in which Jewish people seek the truth from scripture; they debate, they argue, they ask questions.

The expert clearly knew the law, and was able to quote from Deuteronomy and Leviticus. Confident of his knowledge, he then asks Jesus, 'Who is my neighbour?', expecting Jesus to confirm that a neighbour is someone just like him.

The answer he receives is so uncomfortable that he cannot even name the country that the neighbour come from. Crestfallen, he replies:

"The one who had mercy on him."

His interpretation of 'Love your neighbour as you love yourself' was 'Love those who are like you, who are likeminded with you'. Jesus talks about a universal love for everyone.

In the first Comic Relief, Lenny Henry, standing in a community in Africa, said, 'These people are our neighbours, it's just a matter of geography'.

Love is love. This is what the expert in the law failed to understand. He knew the law, he could debate, argue, question, but he didn't understand it's truth. John puts it so well in his first letter:

This is love: not that we loved God, but that He loved us and sent His Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins ... God is love. Whoever lives in love lives in God, and God in Him ... We love because He first loved us. 1 John 4: 10, 16, 19 (ANIV)

Or as the Christian singer-songwriter sang:

'Without love you ain't nothing, you ain't nothing without love.'
