O God

You declare Your almighty power most chiefly in showing mercy and pity: mercifully grant to us such a measure of Your grace, that we, running the way of Your commandments, may receive Your gracious promises, and be made partakers of Your heavenly treasure; through Jesus Christ Your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with You,

REFLECTION: Trinity 11

'O Lord it's hard to be humble, when you're perfect in every way'. So sang the country singer Mac Davis.

Even as Christians, it's easy for us to fall into the trap that we are the centre of our own world; to think I'm doing just fine because I have Jesus living in me.

Jesus warns against such feelings:

"When someone invites you to a wedding feast, do not take the place of honour, for a person more distinguished than you may have been invited"

CS Lewis is often quoted as saying that humility is:

"... not thinking less of yourself, but thinking of yourself less"

The Bible constantly challenges us to look outside of ourselves, to the widow, the orphan, the alien in our midst. Jesus said, "But when you give a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind, and you will be blessed."

One view from 'the world' is that we say we are a Christian, we are therefore claiming a level of perfection. I've lost count of the number of times people have said to me, 'And you a Vicar!' or 'And you say you're a Christian' when I've said or done something that doesn't fit their view of how a Christian should be.

Maya Angelou wrote:

When I say ... "I am a Christian" I'm not shouting, "I'm clean livin'."

I'm whispering, "I was lost, now I'm found and forgiven."

When I say ... "I am a Christian", I don't speak of this with pride.

I'm confessing that I stumble and need Christ to be my guide.

When I say ... "I am a Christian", I'm not trying to be strong.

I'm professing that I'm weak and need His strength to carry on.

When I say ... "I am a Christian", I'm not bragging of success.

I'm admitting I have failed and need God to clean my mess.

When I say ... "I am a Christian", I'm not claiming to be perfect,

My flaws are far too visible. But, God believes I am worth it.

When I say ... "I am a Christian", I still feel the sting of pain.

I have my share of heartaches so I call upon His name.

When I say ... "I am a Christian", I'm not holier than thou,

I'm just a simple sinner who received God's good grace, somehow.
