COLLECT FOR HOLY CROSS

Almighty God,

who in the passion of Your blessed Son made an instrument of painful death to be for us the means of life and peace: grant us so to glory in the cross of Christ that we may gladly suffer for His sake; who is alive and reigns with You, in the unity of the Holy Spirit,

one God, now and for ever.

REFLECTION: Holy Cross

'Mr Topsy-Turvy was a funny sort of a fellow. Everything about him was either upside down, or inside out, or back to front – topsy turvy in fact'

I think that Mr Topsy-Turvy would have understood the topsy-turvy way in which God showed His love for us.

God didn't send a might warrior, or a great populist political leader.

He sent His Son.

'who, though He was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God as something to be exploited, but emptied Himself, taking the form of a slave, being born in human likeness.

And being found in human form, He humbled Himself and became obedient to the point of death— even death on a cross.' Philippians 2:6-8

He sent His Son, born not in a palace, but in a backstreet hostel.

He sent His Son, not to important people, to rulers and chief priests, but to fishermen, tax collectors, 'sinners', the ordinary folk.

He sent His Son, not to teach rebellion against the occupying Romans, or to hate those different from yourself, but to forgive, seventy times seven, and to love with all your heart, mind, and strength.

He sent His Son, not to storm the places of power, but to stretch out His arms on the Cross to say, I love you, I love you, I love you'.

"For God so loved the world that He gave His only Son, so that everyone who believes in Him may not perish but may have eternal life. John 3:16

As we stand at the foot of the Cross we have a choice - a choice that will affect the rest of our lives.

To believe in God's Son, and have everlasting life.

Or to reject Him ...
