REFLECTION: Trinity 14

When people are waiting for The King to enter the Royal Box at the theatre, or the House of Lords for the State Opening of Parliament, there is a hushed awe.

It's not only a regard for the position of Head of State, it is also respect for King Charles himself.

Every Sunday, we have the privilege to come into the presence of God in a place set aside for worship.

Just think about that for a moment.

We have the privilege to come into the presence of God.

Yes, God is with us at all times and in all places. But in worship, we deliberately come into His presence.

When Christ died on the cross, the temple curtain was torn in two from top to bottom, symbolising the 'new and living way' to God. God is no longer hidden in the holy of holies. His desire, His invitation, is for us to come into His very presence; to worship in spirit and in truth.

Yet how often do we rush into church with five minutes to spare before the beginning of the service, then spend time chatting, just checking something important with the churchwarden or a PCC member, arranging that urgent thing to do with the fete or upcoming event.

And, yes, we ministers don't always set a good example.

How about this Sunday arriving a little earlier and spending the time preparing ourselves for worship, preparing ourselves to come into the presence of God. And then doing the chatting and church busyness afterwards over coffee.

During the service ... let God speak to you

After the service ... speak to each other

Allow people peace and quiet with God ... think, pray, meditate.
