Collect for Baptism of Christ

Eternal Father,
who at the baptism of Jesus
revealed Him to be Your Son,
anointing Him with the Holy Spirit:
grant to us, who are born again by water and the Spirit,
that we may be faithful to our calling
as Your adopted children;
through Jesus Christ Your Son our Lord,
who is alive and reigns with You,
in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

REFLECTION: Baptism of Christ

In a simple action, Jesus chooses to lay aside His majesty.

He steps into the River Jordan to be baptised.

Of course, His majesty had been laid aside when He took on human flesh to be born in a stable. But that had been God's choosing.

Now Jesus chooses for Himself. It's as if He was saying, 'I submit myself to the task to which God has called me'.

And afterwards He goes out into the wilderness for forty days to understand from God what the task is.

In the wilderness, as His task is revealed to Him, He is tempted to take back His majesty; to bend the rocks to His will, to show that He is protected by the angels, to take all the kingdoms of the world and their splendour as His own.

And He resists.

He resists because the majesty belongs to God.

He resists because He came to be one of us, one with us.

He resists so that we might believe through faith that He is who He says He is.

In the wilderness, the Father revealed His task to Jesus.

*There was no other good enough
To pay the price of sin;
He only could unlock the gate
Of heaven, and let us in.*

Jesus says to us, 'As the Father sent me so I am sending you'. He has a task for each one of us.

No one else can do the task which Jesus has given to you. Only you can do it. You are unique in character and gifting to be able to do the task.

As Jesus laid aside His majesty to fulfil that which God called Him to, so we lay aside all thoughts of gain and status. The Westminster Shorter Catechism states that 'Man's chief end is to glorify God, and to enjoy Him for ever'.

*You laid aside Your majesty, gave up everything for me,
Suffered at the hands of those You had created.
You took all my guilt and shame, when You died and rose again;
Now today You reign, in heaven and earth exalted.*
